Specific Tournament Information

Deadline: All entries must be received no later than one week prior to the first event. Late entries may be accepted only at the discretion of the Tournament Director.

USATT Sanction: This tournament has a USATT 0-Star Sanction Level. A USATT membership or Single Tournament Pass is required for entry into all singles rating events, and results from those events will be sent to USATT for inclusion in USATT player ratings calculations.

Unrated Players: Players who do not already have a USATT rating may enter a rating event. Unrated players in events with defined rating limits WILL get credit for matches won in the first round in terms of USATT rating point accrual, BUT they may NOT advance into a second-round group. Unrated players may be seeded in the draw at the sole discretion of the Tournament Director.

Format for Events: Round robin (RR) groups will be formed for first rounds of all rating events. So, each player is assured of multiple matches in the first round. Any additional rounds may be either RR or an elimination format. The choice of second-round format will be made at the sole discretion of the Tournament Director.

General Tournament Information

Reporting and Starting Times: Players should check-in at the control desk 30 minutes prior to their first event's start time. Players that arrive late may be defaulted for the entire event (and replaced by an alternate) at the discretion of the referee.

Practice: The gym will be open for warm-up and practice at 8:30am.

Refunds: No refunds.

Rules: The Laws of Table Tennis as published by ITTF and all USATT regulations will be enforced.

Equipment: Only USATT/ITTF approved equipment will be used. Butterfly Centerfold tables; Butterfly Europa net sets; Gambler white 3-star P40+ (plastic) balls; wooden floors.

- **Rackets:** One side of the racket must be bright red or another color recently approved by ITTF, the other side black. No complete re-gluing unless it is a new sheet of rubber. Partial re-gluing may be done with the permission of and under supervision of the referee.
- **Clothing:** The USATT Dress Code applies. The main color of the body of the shirt or shorts may not be white. Please come dressed to play. Designs or lettering that are distracting to an opponent or are offensive will not be permitted. Rubber-soled, non-marking, shoes must be worn.

PERSONS IN POSITIONS OF AUTHORITY MUST BE FULLY SAFE SPORT COMPLIANT

Under USATT Safe Sport Policy, persons holding certain **Positions of Authority** must complete SafeSport Training offered by the US Center for Safe Sport (once per year) and undergo a criminal background screen (every two years). The list of Positions of Authority requiring **Full Safe Sport Compliance** is set out in USATT's Safe Sport Policy and the Athlete Safety Section of the USATT Website: <u>https://www.teamusa.org/usa-table-tennis/athlete-safety/safe-sport</u>.

USATT COACHING POLICY

All persons who are engaged in **coaching activities** at USATT Affiliated Member Clubs and/or USATT Sanctioned Tournaments, **except parents or legal guardians coaching their own children**, must be **Fully Safe Sport Compliant**, which requires completing SafeSport Training offered by the US Center for SafeSport every year and undergoing a criminal background screen every two years.

ADULT PARTICIPANTS REQUIRING SAFESPORT TRAINING

Pursuant to USATT's Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policy, <u>ALL Adult Participants</u> (participants over the age of 18) **who have regular contact with or authority over minor aged athletes** must complete SafeSport Training offered by the US Center for SafeSport every year ("SafeSport Trained").

CONTACT USATT TO BECOME SAFESPORT TRAINED AND/OR FULLY SAFE SPORT COMPLIANT

USATT is pleased to assist USATT Members in the process of becoming SafeSport Trained and/or Fully Safe Sport Compliant. Please contact USATT at <u>Admin@usatt.org</u> for more information and guidance in this process.

MANDATORY REPORTING

There are certain circumstances where **reporting a potential Safe Sport violation is mandatory**. These circumstances include: (i) child abuse; (ii) sexual misconduct; (iii) emotional and physical misconduct; (iv) criminal charges and/or dispositions involving sexual misconduct or misconduct involving minors; (v) any abuse of the Safe Sport process. **Child abuse must be immediately reported to local law enforcement.** To learn more about the appropriate agency where you can submit a report of child abuse, log onto: <u>https://www.childwelfare.gov/topics/responding/reporting</u>.
